Object Functions

Working on functions is so easy to do, all you need is a box of everyday objects collected from around your home.

- Give your child a choice of two or three objects from the box.
- Ask your child questions related to the choice of objects, for example, "Which one do you throw?" or "Which one tells the time?"



Make it easier: Begin the activity by using objects that your child is already very familiar with.

Make it harder: After mastering identifying object functions you can move on to expressing object functions and let your child tell you how we use each object.
