


Is it 'she' or 'he'?

Begin by either drawing pictures or cutting out pictures of a boy and girl from a magazine. Write she and he underneath picture. You will need to collect some everyday objects or toys your child is familiar with too.

Talk with your child about a girl being a 'she' and a boy being a 'he'. Say to your child, "She would like a teddy." See if your child places the teddy on the correct person. Carry on with on with other statements. For example, "He would like a pencil." Try this a few times with different objects/toys until your child is confident with understanding the concept of, she and he.

Make it easier: Accompany with a Makaton sign.

Make it harder: Remove the words 'he' and 'she'. Place an item on top of a picture and ask, "Who has got the teddy?".



Encourage your child to respond with "She has got the teddy."

Most of all enjoy and have fun with your child!
