

# **SOLIHULL METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL**

## **The Metropolitan Borough of Solihull (Neville Road, Shirley) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 2020**

### **Statement of Reasons**

Through the council's established Traffic Regulation Order Framework process Neville Road was identified as a priority location in the 2020/21 works programme to be considered for the introduction of new or amended parking restrictions.

The restrictions are proposed in response to local concerns and aim to regulate on-street parking. They will address obstructive all day parking by commuters. This is intended to aid the free passage of traffic.

Presently there are double yellow lines at the junction of Neville Road and Sansome Road. There is a single yellow line (no waiting, Monday to Friday, 9am – 11am & 2pm – 3pm) at the junctions of Neville Road/Binton Road and Neville Road /Lindridge Road.

The section of road where there are no parking restrictions between Sansome Road and Lindridge Road is experiencing obstructive parking which is causing access issues for residents. We have received reports that on occasion the road has been blocked or difficult for vehicles to negotiate.

It is proposed to extend the existing single yellow line (no waiting Monday to Friday, 9am – 11am and 2pm – 3pm restriction) to cover both sides of the carriageway from Sansome Road to Lindridge Road.

It is also proposed to extend the restriction to Hawkesbury Road on the east side of the carriageway only. The proposal will cover the junction of Neville Road and Hawkesbury Road. This will alleviate any current obstructive parking and also address possible displaced parking.

It is recommended that the restrictions are advertised as shown on Plan 8672 and subject to feedback received in the statutory process that the order be made as advertised.

The local ward members are aware of the intention of Officers to advertise the proposal.
