Notice is given in accordance with the School Organisation (Prescribed Alterations to Maintained Schools) (England) Regulations 2013 and the Education and Inspections Act 2006 that Solihull Council proposes to make a prescribed alteration, by expanding Cheswick Green Primary School from 1 September 2022.

The School Organisation Plan 2020, identifies the need to add school places to meet the additional demand from strategic housing sites, including the site at Blythe Valley Park, to ensure that the Council meets its statutory duty to provide sufficient school places.

Cheswick Green Primary School is the primary catchment area school for the residential developments at both Cheswick Place and Blythe Valley Park and this proposed expansion will cater for families resident in both developments. In addition the school will continue to provide early years places for 2 & 3 years olds.
