

# COVID-19 - Solihull Data Summary, 19th March 2021

### **Summary**

- The number of new cases was 178 cases in the 7 days to 12<sup>th</sup> March, a rate of 82.3 per 100,000 population, an increase of 62% on the previous week.
- Information about Covid vaccine uptake by priority group and electoral ward is given in this bulletin.
- At 18<sup>th</sup> March, there were 177 Covid positive inpatients in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust hospitals, compared with 283 on 10<sup>th</sup> March.
- There were 7 Covid related deaths of Solihull residents in w/e 5<sup>th</sup> March (deaths registered up to 13<sup>th</sup> March). (Source: ONS).


# **Weekly Cases and Rates**

COVID-19 cases are identified by taking specimens from people and sending them to laboratories around the UK to be tested. If the test is positive, this is referred to as a lab-confirmed case.

#### **New Cases**

In the 7 days to 12<sup>th</sup> March, Solihull had 178 new lab-confirmed cases, a rate of 82.3 per 100,000 population. This was an increase of 62% on the previous week (to 5<sup>th</sup> March). Much of the increase is concentrated in the Smith's Wood and Kingshurst areas while there have also been small increases in a number of other wards.


Below is a map showing the 7-day rates for Solihull and neighbouring areas.






The breakdown of cases in Solihull by week over time is shown below. It should be noted that case numbers prior to May are not directly comparable as there was much more restricted access to testing.

#### **Total Cases**

The total number of lab-confirmed cases in Solihull since the start of the pandemic was 14273 at 17<sup>th</sup> March. #### **Number of New Cases by Ward**

The table below shows the number of new lab-confirmed cases by ward for the 14 days between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> March (the most recent period for which data is available). The number of new cases in the previous 14 days is also shown for comparison. It should be noted that, as electoral wards are relatively small areas, the wards with highest and lowest number of cases are liable to change.

7 of the 17 wards had more cases in the most recent 14 days than in the previous 14 days. Smith's Wood, Kingshurst & Fordbridge and Chelmsley Wood wards have had the most confirmed cases in the last 14 days.

#### **Reproduction Number (Rt)**

The reproduction number is the number of people that one infected person will pass on a virus to, on average. If the reproduction number is higher than one, then the number of cases increase exponentially. If the number is lower the disease will eventually stop spreading, as not enough new people are being infected to sustain the outbreak. # **Vaccinations**

The table below shows uptake of the first dose of the Covid-19 vaccine by priority group and electoral ward at 15<sup>th</sup> March. Data is on Birmingham and Solihull CCG registered patients who are resident within Solihull.

Increasing uptake in areas where fewer people have been vaccinated is a key local priority and area of focus for the local NHS & council, working with local communities.



#### **Schools**

Schools currently report all confirmed cases of COVID-19 to Public Health England and the Public Health Team at Solihull Council. Both provide schools with advice on identifying close contacts of confirmed cases and support with making decisions on further infection control measures, including sending bubbles home.

Below is the number of lab-confirmed cases in Solihull primary and secondary schools in the last 14 days:

#### **Hospital Inpatients**

At 18<sup>th</sup> March, there were 177 Covid positive inpatients in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust hospitals, compared with 283 on 10<sup>th</sup> March. This includes 21 in Intensive Treatment / High Dependency Units, compared with 36 on 10<sup>th</sup> March. This will include a number of Solihull residents although the majority will be Birmingham residents (source: UHB Inpatient reports, 10<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> March).

Weekly Death Registrations and Occurrences (latest data published covers deaths registered up to w/e 13<sup>th</sup> March 2021)

As of the week ending 13<sup>th</sup> March, there have been 626 deaths of Solihull residents that mention COVID-19. 7 COVID-19 deaths occurred in the latest week.
