

COVID-19 - Solihull Data Summary, 26th March 2021

Summary

- The number of new cases was 185 cases in the 7 days to 19th March, a rate of 85.5 per 100,000 population, an increase of 3% on the previous week.
- Information about Covid vaccine uptake by priority group and electoral ward is given in this bulletin.
- At 24th March, there were 127 Covid positive inpatients in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust hospitals, compared with 177 on 18th March.
- There were 7 Covid related deaths of Solihull residents in w/e 12th March (deaths registered up to 20th March). (Source: ONS).


Weekly Cases and Rates

COVID-19 cases are identified by taking specimens from people and sending them to laboratories around the UK to be tested. If the test is positive, this is referred to as a lab-confirmed case.

New Cases

In the 7 days to 19th March, Solihull had 185 new lab-confirmed cases, a rate of 85.5 per 100,000 population. This was an increase of 3% on the previous week (to 12th March).


Below is a map showing the 7-day rates for Solihull and neighbouring areas.






The breakdown of cases in Solihull by week over time is shown below. It should be noted that case numbers prior to May are not directly comparable as there was much more restricted access to testing.

Number of weekly Covid-19 cases in Solihull since 13 March (week ending), Total cases to date = 14411



Total Cases

The total number of lab-confirmed cases in Solihull since the start of the pandemic was 14411 at 24th March. Number of New Cases by Ward

The table below shows the number of new lab-confirmed cases by ward for the 14 days between 10th and 23rd March (the most recent period for which data is available). The number of new cases in the previous 14 days is also shown for comparison. It should be noted that, as electoral wards are relatively small areas, the wards with highest and lowest number of cases are liable to change.

7 of the 17 wards had more cases in the most recent 14 days than in the previous 14 days. Smith's Wood, Kingshurst & Fordbridge and Chelmsley Wood wards have had the most confirmed cases in the last 14 days.

Reproduction Number (Rt)

The reproduction number is the number of people that one infected person will pass on a virus to, on average. If the reproduction number is higher than one, then the number of cases increase exponentially. If the number is lower the disease will eventually stop spreading, as not enough new people are being infected to sustain the outbreak. Vaccinations

The table below shows uptake of the first dose of the Covid-19 vaccine by priority group and electoral ward at 25th March. Data is on Birmingham and Solihull CCG registered patients who are resident within Solihull.

Schools

Schools currently report all confirmed cases of COVID-19 to Public Health England and the Public Health Team at Solihull Council. Both provide schools with advice on identifying close contacts of confirmed cases and support with making decisions on further infection control measures, including sending bubbles home.

Below is the number of lab-confirmed cases in Solihull primary and secondary schools in the last 14 days:

Hospital Inpatients

At 24th March, there were 127 Covid positive inpatients in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust hospitals, compared with 177 on 18th March. This includes 14 in Intensive Treatment / High Dependency Units, compared with 21 on 18th March. This will include a number of Solihull residents although the majority will be Birmingham residents (source: UHB Inpatient reports, 18th and 24th March).

Weekly Death Registrations and Occurrences (latest data published covers deaths registered up to w/e 20th March 2021)

As of the week ending 12th March, there have been 634 deaths of Solihull residents that mention COVID-19. 7 COVID-19 deaths occurred in the latest week.
