

COVID-19 – Solihull Data Summary, 29th October 2021

Summary


- The number of new cases was **1133** in the 7 days to **22nd October**, a rate of **523.6** per **100**,000 population, an increase of **13%** on the previous 7 days.
- Information about Covid vaccine uptake by age group and electoral ward is given in this bulletin.
- At 27th October, there were 222 Covid positive inpatients in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS
 Foundation Trust hospitals, compared with 227 on 21st October.
- There were 5 Covid related deaths of a Solihull resident in w/e 15TH October (deaths registered up to 23rd October). (Source: ONS).

Weekly Cases and Rates

COVID-19 cases are identified by taking specimens from people and sending them to laboratories around the UK to be tested. If the test is positive, this is referred to as a lab-confirmed case.

New Cases


In the 7 days to 22nd October, Solihull had 1133 new lab-confirmed cases, a rate of 523.6 per 100,000 population. This was an increase of 13% on the previous 7 days.






The breakdown of cases in Solihull by week over time is shown below. It should be noted that case numbers prior to May 2020 are not directly comparable as there was much more restricted access to testing at that time.

Total Cases

The total number of lab-confirmed cases in Solihull since the start of the pandemic was **32090** at **26**th **October.** The cumulative number of cases over time is shown in the graph below; the full-sized version of this chart can be found at https://coventry-city-council.github.io/covid-19/dashboard/#solihull





Number of New Cases by Ward

The table below shows the number of new lab-confirmed cases by ward for the 14 days between 11TH

October and 24th October 2021. The number of new cases in the previous 14 days is also shown for comparison. It should be noted that, as electoral wards are relatively small areas, the wards with highest and lowest number of cases are liable to change.

Reproduction Number (Rt)

The reproduction number is the number of people that one infected person will pass on a virus to, on average. If the reproduction number is higher than one, then the number of cases increase exponentially. If the number is lower the disease will eventually stop spreading, as not enough new people are being infected to sustain the outbreak. Hospital Inpatients

At 27th October, there were 222 Covid positive inpatients in University Hospitals Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust hospitals, compared with 227 on 21st October. This includes 30 in Intensive Treatment / High Dependency Units, compared with 26 on 21st October This will include a number of Solihull residents although the majority will be Birmingham residents (source: UHB Inpatient reports, 21st October and 27th October)

Weekly Death Registrations and Occurrences (latest data published covers deaths occurred up to 15TH October and registered up to 23rd October 2021)

As of the week ending **15**TH **October**, there have been **695** deaths of Solihull residents that mention COVID-19. **5** COVID-19 deaths occurred in the latest week.
