Some examples of opportunities in the Solihull Borough:

Supply chain:

• North Solihull Social Enterprise Cluster – a network of local social enterprises and trading charities, delivering a range of services and products, both locally and nationally.

Donating equipment and resources:

- Tarmac to repave a community centre driveway
- New kitchen units to help refurbish a village hall's kitchen
- ICT equipment for local digital inclusion, social isolation and employment projects
- Play equipment for outdoor, community spaces

Donating funding:

- Grants to the Solihull Foodbank Network, as well as Holiday Activity and Food Providers (supporting children and young people in receipt of free school meals)
- Contributions towards community grant programmes, delivered in partnership with Heart of England Community Foundation
