Introduction

Welcome to the Specialist Inclusion Support Service's training brochure for 2018 –2019.

Over the last year we have been supporting schools and settings in Solihull to widen their expertise in a range of SEND, through providing a variety of staff training atnd professional development opportunities. We have also been helping schools to embed SEND training, through supporting the development of the 'Lead Practitioner' role for AET and Mental Health First Aid. This successful model for training delivery and consolidating sound inclusive practice will, in 2018/19, also be established for Speech and Language Leads in schools.

Training to support children and young people with SEMH needs continues to be an area of demand and has been highly rated by delegates. One of the new training packages for secondary schools has been Mental Health First Aid training for sixth formers and sixth form staff; this has been a huge success and the feedback from staff and students has been overwhelmingly positive. The Relationship Based Play Approach training will be offered again this year, in addition to a new central course, training staff to support children and young people with attachment difficulties. The taster course offered to SENCos received excellent feedback and I know many schools will want to do this as whole school training, which is also available as part of our bespoke offer.

The 'Working Together to Develop Children's Communication and Language Skills' course, run jointly with the Speech and Language Therapy Service, has been a huge success, supporting staff confidence in delivering training to parents and rated as outstanding by all of the 70 parents who participated. This will be offered next year and we will continue to include some of our most popular courses, which have consistently received excellent feedback from the delegates who have attended. This includes our AET courses and the training for new SENCos; the latter was rated as 'excellent' by a 100% of participants in 2017/18 and said to be 'a great introduction to being a SENCo'.

In addition, our range of tailored 'in house' professional development opportunities has once again proved very popular. This CPD can be delivered to individual schools, organisations or groups of schools, such as collaboratives. We can devise a package with you, based around your key priorities for development. This could be for a whole or part of a training day, or a series of sessions.

This one day course will look at how Relationship Based Play can be used as a powerful and cost effective method of supporting children and young people with Social, Emotional and Mental Health Difficulties. (SEMH)

By the end of the day you will come away with knowledge of how early experiences, particularly those related to neglect, trauma and loss, negatively impact upon a child's ability to form positive relationships with others and how this impacts upon their wellbeing, behaviour and needs within our schools. You will also be aware of what Relationship Based Play is and how it works to support children and young people who display a wide range of emotional, social and mental health difficulties within our schools.

We aim to:

Via a mixture of direct teaching and practical experience, equip participants with the knowledge that will enable them to plan and begin to deliver effective sessions of Relationship Based Play – either on a 1:1 or group basis upon their return to their setting and to be able to demonstrate its impact.

Participants will be able to experience a range of games and activities that are appropriate to the range of students with whom they work.

(It is important to note that although RBP closely uses the principles of Theraplay this training is not providing participants with training in Theraplay itself. It will however signpost participants to specialist Theraplay Training opportunities if they feel that they would like to pursue them.)

From birth, we develop a close bond with our main caregivers (usually our parents). This attachment helps us to learn and develop in a trusting environment, even at such a young age, we know our parents will be there for us. For some children, however, this bond is not formed. There are a multitude of reasons for this, there may be a situation where the caregiver is unable to provide the care and attention required to form a close attachment for reasons which they may not be able to avoid or the child may have been abused, neglected or separated from their parents for other reasons. Whatever the cause, the effect of not forming this bond can lead to attachment difficulties.

Attachment based difficulties, showing themselves mainly as difficulties in the way that we relate to others, are becoming more evident in our classrooms and this course aims to make staff more able identify, understand and support children who may be experiencing these difficulties.

- Via an introduction to Attachment Theory and consideration of neurodevelopment - Participants will be able to understand how early experiences, particularly those related to neglect, trauma and loss, negatively impact the ability to form positive relationships with others and how this impacts upon their wellbeing, behaviour and learning within our schools.
- Participants will be more aware of how children with these difficulties might present in school and education settings and be aware of resources to use to aid their identification.
- Participants will develop an awareness of and experience examples of how children with Attachment Difficulties might be supported in school both as a whole school ethos and in terms of more group and individually based interventions.

Youth Mental Health First Aid in Schools (Two Day Training Course)

What is Youth Mental Health First Aid for Schools and Colleges?

Youth Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) courses are for everyone who works with, lives with or supports young people aged 8-18. They will teach you the skills and confidence to spot the signs of mental health issues in a young person, offer first aid and guide them towards the support they need. In doing so, you can speed up a young person's recovery and stop a mental health issue from getting worse.

Our courses won't teach you to be a therapist - but just like physical first aid, we will teach you to listen, reassure and respond, even in a crisis.

What will I learn on a two day Youth MHFA Schools and Colleges course?

Our Youth MHFA instructors will deliver an intensive two day course which covers a number of key topics. These are:

- * What is mental health?
- * Suicide and psychosis
- * Depression and anxiety
- * Self-harm and eating disorders

The course will include a mix of presentations, group discussions and workshop activities, with our instructors providing a safe learning environment where participants are supported throughout the whole course. Everyone will receive a copy of the Youth MHFA Schools and Colleges manual which is an excellent reference and support resource. After completion of the course you will be issued with an internationally recognised qualification in Mental Health First Aid.

How will attending a Youth MHFA Schools and Colleges course help?

- By the end of the course you will have:
- An in depth understanding of young people's mental health and factors that affect wellbeing
- Practical skills to spot the triggers and signs of mental health issues
- Confidence to reassure and support a young person in distress
- Enhanced interpersonal skills such as non-judgmental listening
- Knowledge to help a young person recover their health by guiding them to further support whether that's through self-help sites, their place of learning, the NHS, or a mix engaging with parents, carers and external agencies where appropriate
- Ability to support a young person with a long term mental health issue or disability to thrive
- Tools to look after your own mental wellbeing

It is preferable to have some knowledge on Dyslexia.

It is estimated that '10% of pupils have dyslexia. 4% are affected severely.' (British Dyslexia Association 2012)

The earlier that children with dyslexia are identified, the better their chances of being successful in school.

A difficulty in learning to read is often only one of several barriers to learning for children with dyslexia. Teachers and staff in schools need to be aware of the range of difficulties associated with dyslexia in order to support children to achieve their full potential.

Research indicates that inclusive teaching of pupils with dyslexia improves the effectiveness of learning for all pupils.

By the end of the session this course aims to help you:

- Identify and understand some of the difficulties experienced by pupils with dyslexia.
- Understand the assessment process, including the role of the Solihull Specific Learning Difficulties Panel.
- Learn how to support reading, spelling and writing tasks in the classroom.
- Understand the implications of poor working memory and consider ways to support in the class.
- Provide an opportunity to look at appropriate resources.

SISS and SLT have developed a 'flexible' and 'adaptable' training package which will enable your staff to deliver a training package to parents to develop their children's communication and language skills.

The course consists of 4 afternoon training sessions from December 18-April 2019 at Valley ARC + 1 in school support session.

Research from Save the Children 2016 states:

• Parents are not responsible for causing speech and language delays, however, by changing the way they talk and listen to their child can make a big difference.

By attending 4 afternoon sessions; two attendees from each school will:

- Become trained in delivering a Training Package which will develop Parent's and Professionals skills within the area of communication and language.
- Receive power points to support the delivery of the training to parents and staff.
- Receive ideas/games and strategies for parents to use with their children.
- Work with other professionals in a 'collaborative approach' to reflect upon 'what works'.
