
#### **Headlines**

- Rate of hospital admissions in Solihull has increased in the last 12 months and is now similar to the England rate
- Solihull is in the mid range of its comparator group for self harm hospital admissions. In
  12-13 it was significantly lower
- Females more likely to be admitted than males
- Younger people more likely to be admitted (partic. 15-24 year olds)
- Patients more likely to be admitted from regeneration area
- Some patients may be admitted for self harm more than once in a year
- Admissions more likely to be for poisoning than physical harm (93% to 7%)






