PARTICULARS OF CLAIM

- The Claimant is the Metropolitan Borough Council with responsibility for the control of anti-social behaviour and planning in Solihull, the area shown marked in red in the map appended hereto. The Claimant owns the public spaces and highways within Solihull as listed in the appendix.
- The Claimant seeks interim and final injunctions pursuant to section 222 of the Local Government Act 1972 and section 1 of the Anti-Social Behaviour Crime and Policing Act 2014 against the Defendants.
- 3. The First Defendant is a prominent member of the Cassidy family, a family of Irish Travellers. He uses aliases including Patrick Cassidy. He presents himself as the leader of the Cassidy family and acts as their spokesman in dealings with the Police and local

authority officers.

- 4. The other Defendants are members of and associates of that family. The Claimant is unable to identify all of the members of the family who are involved in the encampments, however the Claimant has noted the registration numbers of the various vehicles found on each encampment and the schedule appended hereto marked Appendix B shows who owns the vehicle and when each vehicle was seen on an encampment.
- For a number of years, the Defendants, their relatives and associates have made unauthorised encampments and by their unauthorised presence and by their actions caused a nuisance in Solihull.

PARTICULARS

- a. The Defendants have set up numerous unauthorised encampments in Solihull. Since 7 September 2014 the Defendants have set up unauthorised encampments including:
 - i. From 7/9/14 in Chadwick End Recreation Ground;
 - ii. From 19/9/16 around the Stratford Road, Shirley;
 - iii. From 28/9/16 in Hillfield Park, Shirley;
 - iv. From 15/5/17 around the Stratford Road, Shirley;
 - v. From 26/5/17 on Bentley Heath Park;
 - vi. On 30/5/17 on Dorridge Park;
 - vii. From 6/9/17 on Hall Road, Castle Bromwich;
 - viii. From 14/9/17 on the grounds of North Solihull Sports Centre;
 - ix. From 6/10/17 on Hall Road, Castle Bromwich;
- b. The Defendants have caused a nuisance by fly-tipping and littering.
- c. The Defendants have used force and caused criminal damage to effect entry to encampments, including breaking locks, barriers and fences.
- d. The Defendants have caused a nuisance by verbal abuse and threats of violence to local residents and business people.
- e. The Defendants have threatened and assaulted local residents.
- f. The Defendants have caused a nuisance by permitting dogs to bark and to foul the area around their encampments.
- g. The Defendants have committed crimes in the locality of their encampments including shoplifting, criminal damage to property including cars, and sexual

assaults.

- h. The First Defendant has in particular caused a nuisance by organising and inciting other members of the family in their actions.
- i. Full details of the nuisance caused by the Defendants are set out in the witness statements of Inspector Emma Thompson dated 23rd January 2018 and Alan Brown dated February 2018 of which is served herewith.
- 6. As a result of the encampments, the Claimant has suffered loss and damage.
 - a. The Claimant has had to dispose of waste left behind by the Defendants, including human excrement, building and construction waste, gas cylinders and other rubbish.
 - The Claimant's parks and leisure facilities have suffered damage including damage to grass caused by cars driven across it, and damage to fences and gates;
 - c. The Claimant has the cost of policing the encampments and providing extra security.
 - d. The local residents of the area of Solihull have also suffered loss and damage to their business interests.
- 7. The said unauthorised encampments further amount to breaches of planning control.
- 8. The measures taken by the Claimant and the Police to date have not deterred the Defendants from returning to Solihull and the Claimant believes that unless restrained they will continue to cause damage and a nuisance in the area of Solihull.
- 9. Although the Defendants have not been seen in Solihull since 14 October 2017 they are known to have moved to the neighbouring localities of Birmingham and Warwickshire and to have returned from there to Solihull, and the Claimant believes that the Defendants intend and threaten if not restrained to return to Solihull. The Defendants move from site to site when removed by the Claimant or Police, creating further nuisance, causing damage and distress to local residents.
- 10. In the premises, it is necessary and expedient for the promotion and/or protection of the interests of the inhabitants of Solihull and to prevent further apprehended breaches of planning control to seek an injunction to prevent the Defendants and in particular the First Defendant from returning to Solihull and repeatedly establishing unauthorised

encampments and causing a nuisance.

- 11. It is further necessary and expedient to bring these proceedings against persons unknown to deter further unauthorised encampments. It is not possible to identify all of the individuals involved in the encampments and nuisance set out herein. The Claimant particularly seeks an order that the Defendants shall not set up an encampment in any of the sites set out in the list appended hereto marked Appendix B.
- 12. The Claimant accordingly seeks an order against all the Defendants in the terms appended hereto.



- 1. The Defendants are forbidden whether by themselves or by instructing or encouraging or permitting any other person from:
 - a. Engaging in conduct causing or likely to cause a nuisance or annoyance to any person within Solihull;
 - b. Removing or damaging any padlock, lock, bolt or other means of securing any location within Solihull;
 - c. Entering with a view to setting up an encampment on any of the land identified on the attached map at Appendix A, sites numbered 1-37;
 - d. Entering or occupying any of the identified sites at Appendix A numbered 1-37 for residential purposes whether temporary or otherwise including occupying the land with caravans, mobile homes, or other residential structures;
 - e. Entering or occupying any of the land identified on the attached map at Appendix A, sites 1-37;
 - f. Depositing, leaving or dumping any rubbish, building materials, waste products or other refuse anywhere in Solihull except in a receptacle designed for waste disposal.
- 2. This order will remain in force until February 2020.
- 3. This order may be served by
 - a. affixing a copy of it in a transparent waterproof envelope in a prominent position on the land on each of the 36 sites at Appendix A.
 - publishing it in a newspaper such as Solihull News
 - b. Publishing it on the Claimant's website, Facebook and Twitter accounts.
- 4. The Claimant undertakes to use reasonable endeavours to serve the named Defendants personally.
- 5. The Defendants or any of them or any person notified of this order may apply to the Court on 48 hours' notice in writing to the Claimant to vary or discharge this order.

Definitions

- 6. In this order:
 - a. "Solihull" means the area outlined in red on the map annexed hereto;
 - b. "Encampment" means using land for residential purposes, whether temporary or otherwise, including the occupation of caravans, mobile homes, or other vehicles, the use of furniture or the storage of vehicles, caravans or other items.

- c. A person who is ordered not to do something must not do it by himself or in any other way such as by others acting on his behalf, on his instructions or with his encouragement.
- d. Reference to "the Defendants" means each or all of them save as otherwise stated.
- 7. It is a contempt of court for any person notified of this order knowing to assist in or permit a breach of this order. Any person doing so may be sent to prison, fined, or have his assets seized.
