Kyoto Climate Change Conference (1997)	Resulted in imposition of legally binding targets to reduce greenhouse emissions.
Road Traffic Reduction Act (1997)	Places a statutory requirement on local authorities to monitor traffic levels on local roads and consider setting targets for reducing traffic levels.
